## **Safeguarding: Your Safety is Our Priority**

At Stanmore College, we prioritise the safety and wellbeing of all students, including young people and vulnerable adults, regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, disability, language, faith, or sexual orientation. Our commitment to safeguarding encompasses both child protection and a proactive approach to maintaining a secure environment.

Safeguarding at our college includes:

Commitment to Student Safety and Wellbeing:

All staff are subject to Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) checks and staff are trained on how to support and help keep students safe. Stanmore College is closely linked with the Harrow Local Safeguarding Children's Board and the Harrow Prevent Team.

## **Multi-Faith Rooms**

We offer multi-faith rooms to accommodate and respect the diverse spiritual needs of our students, providing a quiet space for reflection and prayer.





## Financial Support

Studying at Stanmore College is an investment in your future. It is essential that attending college remains affordable and that you have access to any eligible financial support. Our Student Services Team can assist with applications for bursaries or additional funding.

Depending on your circumstances and eligibility, support can be available for:

- **Financial Support 16-18:** If your annual gross household income meets the requirement, you may be eligible for a college bursary.
- **16-18 Discretionary Bursary:** If you are a student aged 16-18 as of 31st August, then typically you will not pay any tuition fees, If you are 19 in the academic year, you will be supported under the specific 16-19 Discretionary Bursary.
- **16-19 Vulnerable Learner Bursary (Government Scheme):** Support for vulnerable students in line with the Government/ESFA guidance. If you are aged 16-19 on 31 August of an academic year, you could be eligible for an award to help you towards college related expenses.
- **Free College Meals:** These are offered to you if you are 16-18 on 31st August, or if you are 19+ student continuing because you started your course when 16-18, or if you have an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP).
- **Oyster Cards:** Available for within London and outside London depending on your age and criteria as per TFL's rules.
- **Financial Support for +19/Adults:** Students aged 19 and over on 31st August will normally pay registration, tuition, exam fees, as well as costs for kits, books, activities, or excursions.
- **19+ Discretionary Bursary:** The 19+ Bursary is for learners studying a Level 1, Level 2 or a first full Level 3 qualification. To be eligible you must be aged 19 or over on 31st August, and meet the minimum income requirements.
- **Advanced Learner Loan:** You can apply for a government Advanced Learning Loan if you are aged +19/Adult studying an eligible Level 3 or above course, such as Access to Higher Education (HE).

# Vocational Study Programme

When you enrol at Stanmore College, you'll join a program designed to enhance your technical and professional skills. Our study programs are tailored to your achievements and future goals, offering more than just a qualification. They include essential elements that prepare you for apprenticeships, university, or employment.

## Key areas covered:

- English and Maths lessons (unless you already have GCSE grade 4 or above in these subjects).
- Tutorial lessons.
- Employability / Careers Support to help you with your UCAS applications and finding higher level courses and employment.
- A Work placement with a relevant company.
- Enrichment opportunities including industry-led projects, national competitions or represent the Student Union.

To complete your qualification, you must pass all components of the program. ### T Levels

T Levels are an excellent way for young learners to combine studying with work experience. They are a combination of academic and practical learning, exposing the student to the working world within their chosen T Levels area.

We offer T Levels in: Accounting, Business, Early Years, Engineering, Health & Social Care, IT & Computing, and Science.

# Entry Requirements and Types of Qualifications



We offer a large range of courses at varying levels and the level you study will depend on your previous achievements and qualifications. The following will help you understand which level is correct for you. If you are still unsure on your level, don't worry, apply for what you think is correct. We will invite you to attend an interview where we will have a discussion with you and identify where you need to get started!

## Entry Level (1, 2, 3 and Pre-Entry)

- Gain essential skills for life and progression.
- **Entry requirements:** No formal entry requirements.
- **Progression:** Continue to improve your skills with higher entry level study, move on to Level 1 or find employment.

## Level 1

- Get the core knowledge and skills you need for success at College and in your chosen career.
- **Entry requirements:** Depending on the course, as a guide you may need 2 GCSEs at grades 1-2 or a suitable Entry Level qualification.
- **Progression:** Join a Level 2 course, find an intermediate apprenticeship or junior level employment.
- Examples of Level 1 qualifications: GCSE grades 3-1 (D-G), functional skills Level 1, Level 1 diploma.

## Level 2

- You'll concentrate on your preferred subject and cover all the essentials to progress to employment or next-level study.
- **Entry requirements:** Depending on the course, generally you'll need 3 GCSEs grades 3/D or above at GCSE or an appropriate Level 1 qualification.
- **Progression:** Step up to Level 3 courses, begin an advanced apprenticeship or find employment/further training.
- Examples of Level 2 qualifications: GCSEs grade 9-4 (A-C), Level 2 certificate, diploma, award, pre-entry Access, functional skills Level 2.

## Level 3

- These courses can provide you with advanced level skills and combine both practical and theoretical specialist knowledge. This level is ideal for those who wish to progress to university or higher level employment.
- **Entry requirements:** Depending on the course, generally you'll need 4 GCSEs grades 9-4/A-C or a suitable Level 2 qualification. Most level 3 courses require English language and maths Level 2 qualifications.
- **Progression:** Choose from employment, an advanced or degree apprenticeship or university.
- Examples of Level 3 qualifications: A levels, Level 3 certificate, diploma, award, T Levels, Access, International Baccalaureate (IB), Scottish Highers. (NB: T Levels, Access courses, Extended diplomas, IBs, and Scottish Highers are considered equivalent to 3 x A levels and often satisfy university entry requirements, depending on the course)

## International qualifications

If you have any qualifications from abroad, please tell us about them. We are often able to compare what your qualifications are equivalent to here, and this will help us decide which is the right level for you.

Within easy reach of the M1 (junction 4), A1(M) and M25. Nearby to Watford, Hatch End, Queensbury, Belmont and Edgware.

### Parking

There is parking available around the side streets of the College.

### By Bus

The following buses stop near the main College site:

**142** From Watford, Bushey, Edgware, Brent Cross, Burnt Oak and Hendon.  
**Nearest Bus stop:** Stanmore Broadway is a 15 minute walk from the College.

**340** From Harrow, Harrow Weald, Canons Park and Edgware.  
**Nearest Bus stop:** Stanmore Broadway, is a 15 minute walk from the College.

**324** From Queensbury, Kingsbury, Hendon, Brent Cross (past Park High School)  
**Nearest Bus stop:** Stanmore College (no bus stop stand).

**H12** From Harrow Weald, Pinner, Hatch End, Rayners Lane and South Harrow (past Hatch End School).  
**Nearest Bus stop:** Stanmore Hill is a 10 minute walk from the College.

### By British Rail

Get to Harrow and Wealdstone station. Take Bus **340** from nearby Stop K station to Bowls Close or Stanmore Broadway. Both stops are a short walk to the College.

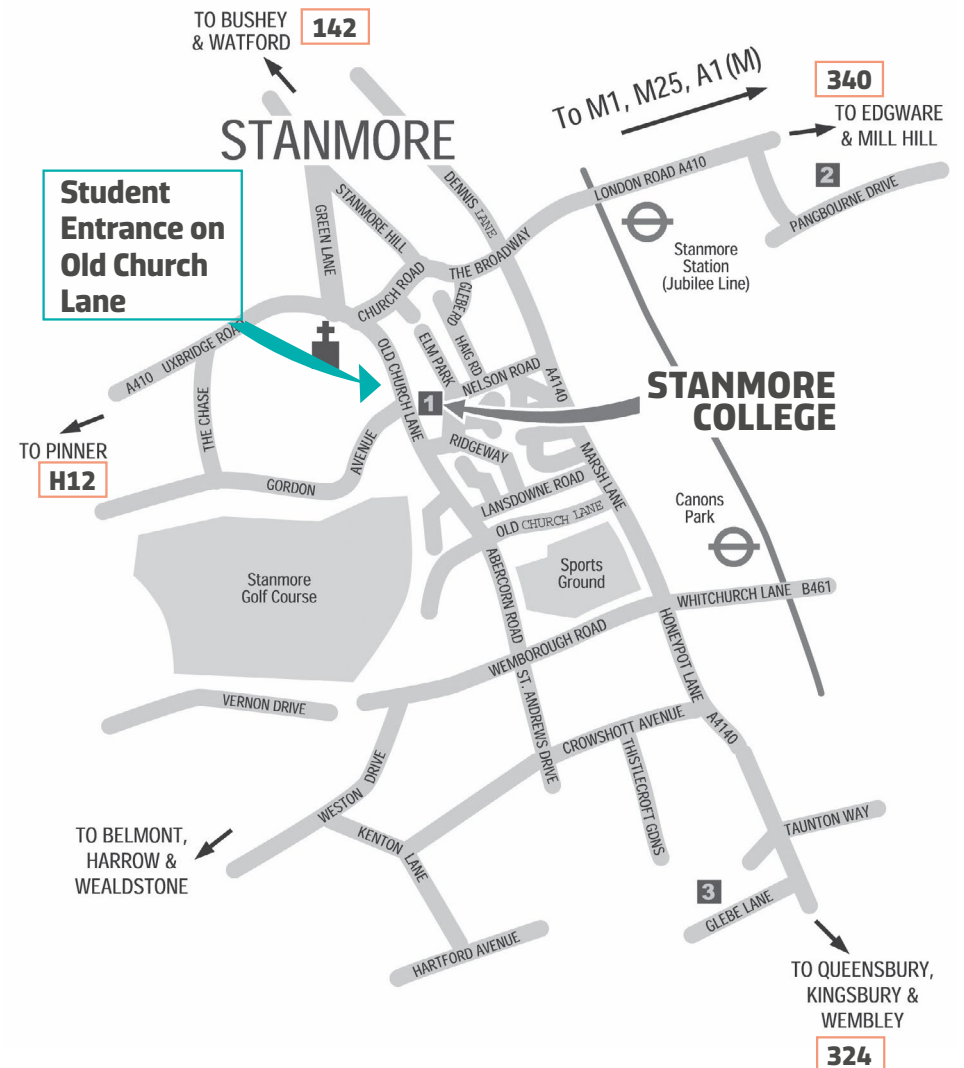


### Walking From Stanmore Station

- Turn left onto London Road at the Stanmore Station exit.
- Walk straight (passing Lidl on your right).
- Walk up the hill (passing Sainsbury's on your left).
- At the traffic lights, turn left onto Church Road (passing Subway on your left).
- Turn Left onto Old Church Lane.
- The main gated entrance is a short walk down from there on the left.

### By Tube

Stanmore Station is on the Jubilee line. Take Bus **142** or **H12** to Stanmore Broadway (15 minute walk to the College) or, a 20 minute walk direct from Stanmore Station.
